This year 2021 has been a rough & tumble time for all of us, but we continue our ancient duty and pledge to honor Meade, his veterans and all veterans. We will gather on Saturday, November 13th at 5:00 p.m. at the Cannstatter (founded by Union Veterans) to celebrate our 25 years of official existence and enjoy each other's company at the Dinner Gala. I would especially thank the unstinting efforts of the members of the Board of Directors and all members for the help and support they have given over the years without which the Society could not have endured!

# Memorial Day Observed at Historic Laurel Hill Cemetery



The Annual Memorial Day ceremony was observed at Historic Laurel Hill Cemetery, on Sunday, May 30, 2021. It recreated the Original G.A.R. Decoration Day Service of the Grand Army Post #1 in 1868.

Everyone is always welcome to attend and participate in the ceremony. Laurel Hill is the site of the first Memorial Day Observance in Philadelphia on this date in 1868.

The event started with a procession to the grave of General Meade and a call to order, presentation of colors and an Invocation Service by Albert El, Chaplin of Legion Post 405. This was followed by a musical interlude by the Philadelphia Brigade Band, laying of wreaths and a volley followed by Taps.

Special bronze veterans' markers were dedicated at the graves of two previously unmarked Civil War veterans researched and found by Russ Dodge, a LHC and Civil War historian. They are:

**Theodore W. Deklyne** served as a Naval officer on board the USS Mystic during the Civil War, and was a Colonel in the post-war Louisiana National Guard, where he worked to implement Reconstruction policies and protect enfranchisement of African-Americans, most of whom had been enslaved prior to the war. He died of yellow fever at the age of 29.



**Dr. George Huhn** served in the 154th Pennsylvania Infantry before being assigned as a post Surgeon to Camp William Penn, the training camp paid for by the Union League to train the African-Americans soldiers who would go on to make up 11 different United States Colored Troop regiments. He died from his exertions in October 1864.



The closing ceremonies continued with wreathlaying, speeches, music and honor guards. The day capped off by a benediction delivered by Legion Post 405 Chaplain Albert El. Refreshments were served after the ceremony.

When Betty worked at Amy's Gift Shop in the Reading Terminal Market, I always made it a point to stop and see her when I was getting ready to take the train home to Ambler after a day of volunteering at the Roman Catholic High School alumni office. # **Treasurer's Report**

As with many other non-profit organizations, the General Meade Society also felt the effects of the continuing uncertainty caused by the COVID-19 pandemic and its delta variant. Membership renewals and donations waned during the second and third quarters (April-September).

However, due to the strong receipts of the first quarter (January-March), as I reported in the last Dispatch, our treasury continues to be very solvent. Two receipts for it are noteworthy. First long time board member and supporter, Dr. Joseph Pugh became a LIFETIME MEMBER, and second, extremely generous donations to the GMS in memory of my wife, Betty have now totaled almost \$700. Thank you Prof. Pugh and those who thought so much of Betty.

As a result of our treasury status, we were able to continue our mission of helping our other partner organizations by donating the following monies:

# OCTAVIUS V. CATTO CEREMONY AT PHILADELPHIA CITY HALL & THE UNION LEAGUE SATURDAY OCTOBER 2, 2021

On Saturday, October 2, 2021, led by society president Anthony Waskie, PhD (MC), several members of the General Meade Society of Philadelphia, and the Catto Society participated in the Memorial Honor Ceremony of the 150th Anniversary of the Assassination of Major Octavius V. Catto, the ceremony was held at the Catto Monument at the South Front of City Hall, in Philadelphia, PA.



Honoring the great African American equal rights and military leader, O.V. Catto (1839-1871), the ceremony was attended by military units, period civilians, veterans, and heritage groups.



The Keynote Address was delivered by BG (Ret) David Wood, of American Legion Post 405, of the Union League of Philadelphia, the speech can be found on the society's website.

Following the ceremonies at City Hall, at the Union League of Philadelphia, (Meade Room) the Pennsylvania National Guard Award Luncheon & Medal Ceremony was held, where the Armed Services Council of the Union League presented the Major O.V. Catto Awards to deserving PA Guardsmen.

#### G.A.R. CIVIL WAR MUSEUM

The Grand Army of the Republic Civil War Museum & Library, after 63 years on Griscom Street, is moving to the historic Lewis-Pattison House at 8110 Frankford Avenue, Philadelphia. The site was originally owned by Thomas Holme, the man for whom the Holmesburg neighborhood was named. Holme sold the property to Robert Lewis and his wife, who built the original stone portion of the house in 1805. The rear portion of the house, built in 1857, is frame construction. The location is more accessible for parking and public transportation and offers more room for the G.A.R. Civil War Museum's programs.

President Joe Perry stated that to accomplish the monumental task of moving the museum over the next few months we will need assistance and financial support.
